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What is The Syracuse Latin School?



The Syracuse Latin School is...

- ❖ A *PUBLIC* elementary school with admissions criteria open to grades K-2 for 2015-2016
- An opportunity for gifted students to receive a rigorous academic program connected to student interests
- A school that supports community service outside of the school day
- A school that welcomes family and community involvement

How is The Syracuse Latin School Structured?

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• 2015-2016 School-year

- o 3 Kindergarten Classes
- o 3 1st Grade Classes
- o 2 2nd Grade Classes

*Syracuse Latin will continue to grow ONE (1) grade per year into a Kindergarten – 5th Grade School by 2018



What is The Classical Model of Education?



- A challenging liberal arts program
- Focus on the study of Latin language and the classics
- Instructional program is accelerated and highly structured
- An explicit three-part process (Trivium) of training the mind:
 - o The Grammar Stage
 - o The Logic Stage
 - The Rhetoric Stage

The vision of The Syracuse Latin School is to celebrate learning by providing an academically rigorous curriculum with a focus on leadership, citizenship and intellectual growth.

What Does this look like at **The Syracuse Latin School?**

- Use of the Core Knowledge program for English/ Language Arts block
 - Core Knowledge is a comprehensive program that builds students' knowledge and vocabulary in essential domains in literature, American and global history and the sciences.
 - Ocontent includes:
 - × Kindergarten: The Five Senses, Plants, Native Americans, Taking Care of Earth
 - x 1st Grade: The Human Body, Early World Civilizations, The History of the Earth, Animals & Habitats

World Classical Language offering beginning in Kindergarten

What this looks like...

- ✓ All students are immersed in Spanish instruction 3 times per week.
- ✓ Spanish instruction also occurs in small groups during other content areas such as mathematics and social studies

Instructional Extensions to curriculum that allow students to explore content in-depth

What this looks like...

- Students complete an interdisciplinary project once per quarter
- ✓ Weekly *Enrichment Clusters* provide students the opportunity to choose and learn more about topics that are of interest to them


























Individual Learning Portfolios that will follow a students' educational journey

What this looks like...

- ✓ Students complete weekly reflection journal that allows them to reflect on the previous week's content and set goals for the week ahead
- ✓ Students track their learning with individual data binders and student portfolios

Commitment to Community Service and how students make sense of the world around them

What this looks like...

- ✓ Students participate in at least one community service project each quarter. The project is the vision of the students and supported by the adults!
- Projects have included:
 - Making placemats for "Meals on Wheels"
 - ✓ "Keep our Babies Warm" donations and making fleece blankets
 - ✓ Turkey Trot and Salvation Army Food Drive




