Preparing Your Preschooler for Kindergarten Success: A **Guide for Families** (This workshop is focused on families with PreK students that receive Special **Education Services**)

Session I (Room 125) Facilitator: Jackie Adamo

This presentation guides families on preparing preschoolers for kindergarten, with a focus on children not in formal pre-k settings and those with special needs. It emphasizes the importance of early preparation and covers key areas such as language development, social

skills, motor skills, and basic math and pre-literacy concepts. The presentation offers practical, age-appropriate activities for families to do at home, including reading together, arranging playdates, and using everyday objects for learning. It also addresses the importance of establishing routines and strategies that support basic communication and emotional development. For children with special needs, the presentation suggests consulting healthcare providers and developing tailored strategies. Lastly, it provides information on accessing community resources and support to aid in the kindergarten preparation process.

The CPSE (Committee on Preschool Special Education) supports children identified with special needs ages 3–5. As children approach kindergarten age, their services must be reviewed to determine eligibility for CSE (Committee on Special Education) services, which begin at age 5 or when they enter kindergarten. This presentation will explain the important steps in your child's transition from Preschool Special Education (CPSE) to Kindergarten School-Age Special Education (CSE) services. We will outline how the process works, what to expect at each stage, and what documents you'll need to complete.

Practical Strategies and Challenges When Supporting Your Young Child's Social Development at Home: A Round Table Discussion
