History & Geography (2 units)	Just the title of a course is not enough detail to say what is being taught. More information is needed, either book/online curriculum name or detailed main topics that will be covered.	
Science (2 units)	7th grade science  While the grade level is listed, there is no indication of the topics that will be taught and no details listed.	
Mathematics (2 units)	7th grade math  - Calculator - Flash cards - Graphing paper  These types of materials are not required in the IHIP and do not constitute a plan of instruction
